

Ambassador William E. Brock is co-chair of the US-China Clean Energy Forum. He also is counselor and trustee of the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington, D.C. Ambassador Brock served four terms as a member of Congress from Tennessee's Third District and subsequently in the U.S. Senate. He chaired the Republican National Committee (1977–1980) and served in the cabinet of President Reagan as the U.S. trade representative (1981–1985) and as U.S. secretary of labor (1985–1987). Ambassador Brock was one of the founders of the National Endowment for Democracy. He has been recognized (by *The Financial Times* of London, along with three others) as a principal “father” of the Uruguay Round of Trade Negotiations—and of its result, the World Trade Organization (WTO). In 1993, the National Academy of Human Resources awarded Ambassador Brock its highest tribute for outstanding life achievement in advancing human development.
