James Areddy is a Shanghai-based correspondent for The Wall Street Journal. He was a joint winner in 2007 of the Pulitzer Prize for International Reporting and twice received awards from the Society of Publishers in Asia.

In his two-decades at the U.S. newspaper and Dow Jones & Co., he has written stories for every section of the Journal. Currently, his primary area of coverage is the financial sector, including the stock market, banking and currency markets, but his journalism extends through a broad range of non-financial subjects, such as industrial, political and societal trends.

Mr. Areddy moved to Shanghai in 2002 after a yearlong John S. Knight Fellowship for Journalists scholarship at Stanford University in California. Previously, Mr. Areddy spent over eight years in Hong Kong writing for Dow Jones and a similar amount of time in New York City.

Mr. Areddy is a graduate of Marquette University, where he studied finance and marketing. He speaks Mandarin Chinese. In Shanghai, he lives with his wife, a designer, and their young daughter.
