# Background

- **Climate Change – Energy Efficiency – Clean Energy**
  - Common Cause with enormous multi-lateral support
  - Cross-sector commercial opportunities roadmap by Greentech
  - Bi-lateral US-China Clean Energy Forum for dialogue and focused policy advocacy
  
- **Criteria for concrete action**
  - Need to transform opportunities and policy needs into collaborative action.
  - Businesses will develop technologies and opportunities.
  - In-country business partnership and joint action critical to accelerated market development.
  - Government and policy support critical to success.

# ECP Proposal

- **US-China Energy Cooperation Program (ECP)**
  - A bi-lateral public-private partnership
  - Companies interested in partnering and have potential contributions.
  - US and Chinese government policy support
  - Funding is both private (jointly from companies) and public (government funding support).
  - Focus is on company-led and company-driven action and green business generation – joint projects that can accelerate and build capacity.
  
- **Initial status and plans**
  - Two dozen companies have expressed interest in helping to launch – such as Boeing, Cummins, GE, Intel, Peabody, UTC, Westinghouse
  - Strong support from USG agencies – Embassy and Washington DC
  - First meeting to launch activities by end of September.
  - Official launching October or November.
